Why & How to Hire an Architect for Your Home Building Project

Working with an AIA architect can be rewarding. If you have unique tastes and need help translating your ideas into a workable building design that will meet building codes and safety requirements, working with an architect will help.

General building designs may prove helpful to start the process of designing but they often disregard the conditions of your specific building site and may not fully reflect your personal preferences and needs.

Architects can offer creative ideas to help refine your vision and help you to navigate the complexities of the construction process.

- AIA architects remain current with professional standards through continuing education, and subscribe to a Code of Ethics and Professional Conduct that assure clients, the public, and colleagues of their dedication to high standards in professional practice.
- An AIA architect will work with you throughout the design process to help you create a building that reflects your preferences and satisfies your needs for the project.
- An AIA architect will work with you to help choose appropriate materials for your building, solicit bids for construction, review pricing for fairness to address your budget, and assess the quality of the workmanship.

- An AIA architect can help you evaluate the wide range of product choices available as well as with your furniture, fixture & equipment needs.

What to look for in an Architect

- Every architect brings their own combination of skills, expertise, interests, and values to your project. A personal interview will help find the architect that best fits your personal style and aligns closely with the needs of your project.
- Be sure to look for a design professional who (a) has graduated from an accredited academic program in architecture, (b) is licensed/ registered in the state where your home will be constructed, and (c) is a member of the American Institute of Architects. Members of the AIA are most knowledgeable about current trends, issues, methods, codes and safety guidelines relative to your building project.
- Consider requesting an Architect's Qualification Statement, a standardized form which will provide information you to review before selecting an architect, including credentials.
